

The thrill of excitement on charity store hunts for epic bargains, looting your olds collection and finding gold, or the internal arguments with your bank balance to justify buying that newly minted Bowie record - these are all things to look forward to once you become a vinyl junkie.


Vinyl sales were sadly crushed in the early 90s to make way for cassette tapes and discs, and then they were subsequently abandoned for digital downloads and streaming services. But thankfully a love affair with vinyl has sparked again, its popularity is soaring and revenues are on the up.

Legendary artists works such as Oasis, Bob Dylan, The Rolling Stones are all being reissued and selling like pricey little hot cakes. And newer artists, including a load of talented Australia musicians, are starting to press their tunes onto some pretty mint vinyl.

And if that authentic sound wasn't enough for you to become a convert, the epic cover art alone is worth the purchase. From The Beatles iconic pedestrian crossing on their abbey road record, to Nirvanas Nevermind record featuring the naked baby underwater grasping at a dollar bill. The record sleeve has become one of the most powerful canvasses for artistic expression.

Due to the boom in popularity of vinyl you can find records in the shelves of almost any music or electronics shop these days. But if you want to avoid the soulless corporate chain giants and get some decent customer service from true music lovers, we suggest checking out these sweet digs on the coast.

Rare Groove



Southport **The Latest Supertower**

A vertical city is planned for Southport where residents could be born, learn and then retire in the Southern Hemisphere's tallest tower. Still awaiting approval this trio of towers sitting on the corner of Ferry Rd and Meron St (currently the location of Raw espresso and sushi train amongst other business). If approved and completed this trio of towers would include the tallest on the coast, it doesn't stop there it would also house a hospital, shopping centre, eateries, gym etc. I can see Southport massively changing over the next decade and building like this will be at the forefront.

Spit Resort **(ASF Consortium)**

From what I have seen, I can't see what the fuss is about. We aren't loosing the "spit" as this resort is earmarked for land that isn't even being used. The benefits seem to outweigh the negatives by amount of jobs, tourism and money it would bring in locally. You go to Sydney and visit Darling Harbour and it's a game changer. Steampunk

This fancy new bar opened in Surfers back in April - it's an interesting mix of olde style Victorian revolution style. The décor has lots of brass, cogs, steel and large industrial fans. The location is under the Hilton facing Surfers Paradise Boulevard. It's an interesting mash up of décor definitely worthy of a peek, and you have to try the chicken ribs, yes ribs! Not wings.

Wilderness

The southern end of the Gold Coast is preparing for a new social

playground, with Palm Beach's al fresco dining destination Wildernis Café and Bar opening a contemporary rooftop bar. It's a Mediterranean-inspired, open-air space - perfect for soaking up afternoon rays and sipping on sunset drinks. Connected to the already-established eatery below, the Wildernis Rooftop Bar will be accessible via a secret laneway, adding to the venue's vibe and intrigue.

Komune

This Coolangatta Sunday session icon could be saying goodbye and may come back even better than before as they look to build a new luxury health and hotel complex to replace the current building. There is a number of concerns with the height limit and nearby parking, but if their Bali resort is anything to go by, I think this would be a pretty epic treasure to add to the southern end of the coast.

Snow Park

Well if you like snowboarding but don't actually enjoy being cold we could have the answer. Beer Festival

The location is set as Pratten Park, Broadbeach. The event will showcase craft beers from far and wide, as well as a plethora of the very best food trucks and top local/national music acts as the cherry on the cake.

New Brewery

Another brewery seems to be joining the already tight knit crew of breweries we have on the coast. Lost Palms Brewing Co will be hopefully on the cards for a Spring opening. Currently the brewery is still sourcing all the 20hl capacity brewing equipment from N.Z and finalising all their tasty ales. Small Bar Push

Gold Coast City Council recently passed a move that now allows small bars to operate without providing food or a kitchen. Scotty who runs Bine in Nobby's has been at the forefront of this and already has his finger in a couple of different pies. A British themed little boozer in Broadbeach and another one in Burleigh. This is gunna add so much culture to the city and a great step forward for the Council.

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MATT POOLE OUR KURRAWA CHAMPION

Without a shadow of a doubt the last 12 months of Matt Poole's career have been an awesome achievement since becoming a nipper at age 5 then going professional at 18. This will be his 10th year on the Kellogg's Nutri-Grain professional Ironman series and we finally saw Matty bring home the title! We spoke to Matt about Coast living, his training and what makes him tick.

Where are you originally from?

I was born and raised in Manly, Sydney till I was 18 years old.

What made you move to the Gold Coast?

I moved to the Gold Coast to pursue my Ironman career. The warm winters and huge surf clubs are a lure for any Surf Ironmen.

What's your training program like?

Very loaded. I swim train four mornings a week at Miami pool covering between 4-6km each session, throughout the day I do gym or running sessions which generally last around 30mins. Then in the afternoon I'm in the ocean depending on time of year on any of my crafts surf ski, paddle board, downwind board 12ft or 18ft, and even my SUP board. Through summer my program is specifically just Ironman training but winter I cross into downwind paddleboarding and waterman events, which include SUP.

How many hours a week do you train?

Depending on the time of year usually between 20-30hrs. Sunday is my rest/ recovery day.

How many kilometres do you swim in the pool a week?

In winter I will swim as many as 30km's a week for fitness/ volume, through summer it is more sprint specific and will usually cover between 15-20km.

With all that hard training do you take it easy with the diet or is that fairly strict?

I'm usually pretty relaxed with my diet. We do so much training that we can be a little more lenient. I try eat lots of food but keep it as healthy as possible. The more fuel in the tank, the better the body will perform. Good fuel always makes a car perform better. Its similar concept for our bodies.

After an event do you like to have a drink to celebrate?

Definitely! We work hard, mentally and physically so when we finish up a major event its always good to celebrate and have a few drinks so that you can re-focus and get ready for the next challenge. Its very easy to overtrain and burn out if you don't let your hair down every now and then.

At what point did you decide I'm going to do this as a career?

At 18 I won a junior Australian Ironman title and was awarded automatic qualification into the



a long time ago and its always been the best advice during tough times.

Being an ironman is an amazing job, but turning back the clock if you had taken a different path in life what would you of done for a job?

I was always very active and athletic growing up so no doubt some sort of athlete. I loved surfing and footy growing up which took up most of my spare time, a professional surfer or AFL player would have been fun. I'd say given my size now AFL player would have been more suited.

What will you do when your ironman career comes to an end do you have a backup plan?

I'm making a career and have out of Ironman for almost a decade now. No doubt there will come a time when I get to the end of the Ironman road but for now my full focus is on my training and racing. I've been very fortunate to have some amazing opportunities and sponsors that support me and make this possible so hopefully the life after will include something still in the sporting/media world.

Do you ever see yourself moving back to Sydney?

I wouldn't say never, but definitely not right now. I love living here on the Gold Coast but I grew up in Sydney. My family is still there so if the right opportunity popped up I would have to consider it strongly.

When racing do you a pre-race ritual? or lucky charm that you always have by your side?

Music, I always listen to music, a very old school playlist. It calms me down and relaxes me before big races.

How many Kellogg's Nutri-Grain Professional Ironman seasons have you competed in so far?

I have competed in 10

Ironman series thus far.

What's been your biggest accomplishment by far?

This year I won the Kellogg's Nutri-Grain professional Ironman series title. It was my first. In previous years I have placed on the podium but not won.

What's your goals for the upcoming 17/18 season?

I want to defend my Ironman series title, Ironman Tahiti title, ISA paddleboard World title in Denmark and win back my Molokai 2 Oahu world title from 2014.

What's your biggest strength as an athlete?

My ability to Never give up! I'm extremely tough mentally and physically from over a decade of hard training. No matter what race I'm in, my expectations are always very high and very rarely will I accept defeat.

Any favourite local haunts for coffee, eats & drinks?

Coffee sisters in Broadbeach Waters.

The Mummy

Universal has its sights set on a shared cinematic universe, a universe of monsters, and it all starts with *The Mummy*.

Forget Brendan Fraser's roguish charm. Forget Rachel Weisz's damsel in distress (we know she's done her best to). Tom Cruise has this covered.

The studio is bringing its classic, bandage-wrapped monster back again for another go around. Expect more walking corpses, curses and plagues of [insert your least favourite insect here].

Seeing as we don't really know the details of its main character, it will probably come as little surprise that the rest of the plot is being kept under wraps (no pun intended) at the moment.

The mummy is Ahmanet, a long-dead princess who is disturbed from her resting place and - because what *Mummy* film would be complete without it - casts a curse over the modern world. The action will take place at least in part in London, a focal point of fictional

curses thanks to the British Museum.

Annabelle Wallis (*Peaky Blinders, Grimsby*) is a scientist type who oversees the transport of the titular mummy until something goes horribly wrong because what else were you expecting? The *Rabbitohs* main man Russell Crowe will show up as a character you may have heard of before, one Dr Henry Jekyll... (We mentioned the shared universe, right?)

All Eyez On Me

TUPAC Shakur was an iconic American rapper, record producer and actor in the 90s. His life was cut short when he was shot dead at the age of 25, but he's still ranked as one of the greatest and most influential rappers of all time. (Basically a musical bloody legend)

To mark the 20th anniversary of Tupac's death, a biopic called *All Eyez On Me* is coming to the big screen. The film, which is named after his hit album, will chart the rapper's rags-to-riches life up until the fatal shooting.



The film follows Shakur from his early days in New York City to his evolution into being one of the world's most recognized and influential voices before his untimely death. Against all odds, Shakur's raw talent, powerful lyrics and revolutionary mind-set propelled him into becoming a cultural icon whose legacy continues to grow long after his passing. Lookalike newcomer Demetrius Shipp Jr. plays the lead role - and he couldn't look any more like him.

The House

While many people turn to student loans to afford college tuition, Will Ferrell and Amy Poehler's characters in the comedy *The House* choose to open an underground casino to pay for their daughter's college tuition.

War of the Planet of the Apes

War for the Planet of the Apes is an upcoming American science fiction film directed by Matt Reeves and written by Mark Bomback and Reeves. It is a sequel to the 2014 film *Dawn of the Planet of the Apes* and the third installment in the *Planet of the Apes* reboot series.

Following the events of *Dawn of the Planet of the Apes*, Caesar and the apes are embroiled in a war against an army of humans. As the apes suffer heavy losses, Caesar wrestles with his darker instincts as he resolves to avenge his kind. The war pits Caesar against the humans' leader, a ruthless Colonel, in an encounter that will determine the fate of their species and Earth's future.

Valerian

Alpha's seventeen million inhabitants have converged over time, uniting their talents, technology and resources for the betterment of all. Unfortunately, not everyone on Alpha shares in these same objectives; in fact, unseen forces are at work, placing our race in great danger.

Dunkirk is an epic war film about the desperate evacuation of Allied






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WE CHECK OUT WILDERNIS CAFE AND BAR

Andy Canfield and Josh Bailey, tradies turned restaurateurs, extend their already successful Cafe and Bar, with a Mediterranean style rooftop bar which really captures the surfing lifestyle we love here on The Gold Coast.

Two weeks after the grand opening of the Wildernis Rooftop Bar, I headed down to seventh Ave. in Palm Beach to see how the duo were getting on. I couldn't help my initial thoughts being that these guys were seriously cool, they live, breathe and yeah, even drive this bar!

The self-confessed bachelors wasted no in utilising their building and design skills when constructing this open air, ocean view hangout. I made my way from their ground floor Cafe to the attached rooftop via the hidden lane-alley and with each step through this long, wooden corridor growing my anticipation, I walked up the stairs and was pleasantly surprised when welcomed by the bright, coastal feel of the Hamptons. With a lot

of clean, white space contrasting with dark timber floors, I was immediately drawn to the large bi-fold windows which open up allowing the evening sunsets to be exposed whilst customers sip on their Moscow Mule and Lychee Martinis! Also on offer to help wash away your hard week at work is Ink Gin, produced by Husk Plantation Distillery, which is served on tap here for the first time! With European wines, craft beers and weekly cocktails on offer, the only thirst you'll have will be to visit this place again and that's before I even get started on the new rooftop menu!

The chef has put together a second menu opting for tapas style dishes from marinated olives, salt and vinegar fries to seafood sharing platters and meats and cheeses to compliment the laid back communal vibe. There's nothing quite like gathering around a table with friends and family and tucking into local fresh produce and with the elegant twist on these hot and cold dishes, each tapas looks

and feels exciting (even the house dips with crusty bread looked fancy!) Served are simple classics to the more glamorous of tapas' including a selection of mignonette champagne oysters and porcini and truffle arancini.

The clientele attracted on this particular night was anything but pretentious and I can confidently say, the versatility in the bar was a great asset for them. All under this one retractable roof were girlfriends letting their hair down after a long week, lads having a cheeky beer en route home and the more mature couples enjoying each others' company with a nibble or two. When speaking to the owners, who are born and bred in Palm Beach, they told me they wanted to create a place for the community that would live on for years to come, giving something back by providing more local jobs and having the opportunity to start sponsoring a local football team.

I also got the inside scoop from Andy and Josh that soon they will be hiring out the 80 seated venue for weddings and events which will make a beautiful setting for locals to use. So if a laid back rooftop in the heart of the community, relaxing in the sunshine with ocean views is right up your alley, visit the Wildernis Rooftop Bar where I am sure the friendly staff will welcome you. The venue will be open Friday to Sunday 3.00pm 'til late.



LOCALS THE UNDERCURRENT

Move over lame t shirts that say "Surfers Paradise Lifeguard" or some grim t-shirt that will be used for painting your dad's shed. We now have our own iconic clothes brand that's gonna get peeps frothing! Local brand THE UNDERCURRENT has some of the raddest designs going all with a local flavor, the brand is also on a mission to do good things and helps local charity surf lifesaving Qld. We spoke to the chief in charge of this project local legend Carly Snodgrass about this sexy new brand.

Those tees look rad, who helped with the design?

There are some super awesome artists on the Gold Coast who are sometimes not visible to your general Gold Coaster, unless you go searching for them. I wanted to give these guys the exposure they deserve. I'm certainly no artist, so the local Gold Coast artists we have employed for our first series are Sarah Beetson (designed Surfers Paradise t-shirt), Claudio Kirac (designed Mermaid Beach t-shirt), Eric Koo (designed Burleigh t-shirt), Kiel Tillman (designed Currumbin t-shirt) and Byron Coathup (designed Coolangatta t-shirt). This is just round one though, we will be looking for more Gold Coast artists shortly.

What inspired you to start creating your own clothing line?

Firstly, you only do something like this if you have a love of the Gold Coast, like I do. It can get such a bad rap, even from locals. I wanted to do something positive, that both locals and visitors can also share in. The inspiration really came from my own personal travels around the globe, where I would always try and bring artwork back. It can be quite difficult to get framed artwork on a plane or expensive to send back, so I always end up coming back with clothing, easy to pack. I now have so many tourist t's and it's a nice reminder of where I've been attached to some great memories.

I simply wanted the same for the Coast while promoting local artists.

The artwork on the clothes are incredible, can you pick a favourite?

Ooh you're asking to pick a favourite child. To be honest, I'm a Miami girl, so no doubt that one will be my favourite when it's created.

Can you tell us what you love about the living on the coast?

Our lifestyle is second to none and the opportunities here are boundless for entrepreneurs. I've lived in three other cities around the world, and while the job opportunities are amazing, you get over it when your life is just about work. The Gold Coast is an absolute playground. Work hard and play even harder.

Any favourite local haunts for coffee, eats & drinks?

Coffee: Caffeine Kings (Miami), Niche Espresso (Miami), Commune (Burleigh) or Canteen Coffee (Burleigh).

Eats: Justin Lane, Etsu and Hellenika.

Drinks: Cambus Wallace (order a Sailor Jerry with fresh apple juice or a Moscow Mule). Après Surf (order the Caramello Lemoncello, you won't stop at one).

Understandable its early days for The Undercurrent, but what's some of the biggest challenges been so far?

Surprisingly, we haven't had any yet. Everyone has been so supportive of the project from day dot, it's just moved really quickly and here we are with a pretty cool brand. All the people involved along the way have dropped other things they were working on to assist us in this project, because they believe in it too! That's a fantastic validation that we are on the right path and we've created something that resonates with people.

Can you enlighten us on how The Undercurrent supports surf Lifesaving QLD?

It's hard to put into words what Surf Life Saving Queensland (SLSQ) mean to the Gold Coast. They are intrinsically linked to this city. SLSQ serve both visitors and the locals of the Gold Coast daily by saving lives and protecting our beaches. SLSQ also play an important role in young Gold Coasters who may have grown up participating in nippers. So due to this organisation watching out for our visitors AND creating a culture for locals, of course, we wanted to give something back to them. \$2 from every shirt sold is donated to SLSQ, providing them with funding for their important work. Every little bit helps.

Where can you purchase some of those sweet threads from?

Currently they are only available online, but we will be getting into Gold Coast stores ASAP. We will update our stockists on our site when these are available.

What's next for The Undercurrent?

This is just the beginning. There have only been five suburbs featured for the launch (chosen by the artists), but we do plan on doing a few more in the next series. After suburbs, we'll look at other series that define the Gold Coast, be that sub-cultures, slogans, iconic Gold Coast personalities, the list goes on.




COST
